## *Improving the lives of people affected by AD/HD*

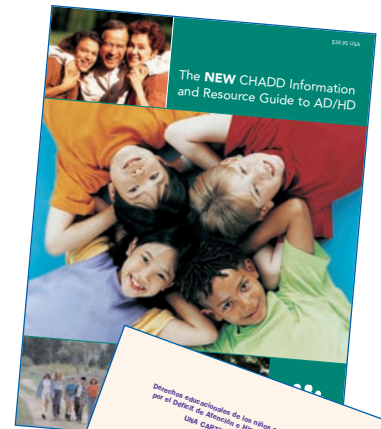
CHADD, the nation's premier information and support organization for individuals and families dealing with attention-deficit/hyperactivity disorder (AD/HD), offers a wealth of science-based services and information to families, clinicians, educational personnel and the media.

The 14,000 member organization, headquartered in Landover, MD, reaches out to families, professionals and others dealing with AD/HD through its bi-monthly magazine, **Attention!**, as well as its Web site ([www.chadd.org](http://www.chadd.org)) and other materials.

CHADD partnered with the U.S. Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) to design and manage the National Resource Center on AD/HD (NRC). The NRC provides live phone support to callers through a toll-free line, with information available in English or Spanish. The NRC Web site ([www.help4adhd.org](http://www.help4adhd.org)) includes the NRC's many "What We Know" fact sheets answering questions on a variety of topics that arise when families and individuals begin to address AD/HD.

### **CHADD offers the following publications:**

- **The New CHADD Information and Resource Guide to AD/HD** is a complete guide to life with AD/HD, from parenting strategies to workplace rights to medication options. The Guide, a \$35 value, is offered at no charge to new CHADD members.
- **Educational Rights for Children with Attention-Deficit/Hyperactivity Disorder (AD/HD): A Primer for Parents** is a dual language publication developed by the NRC with the National Alliance for Hispanic Health. A step-by-step guide to the special education process in Spanish and English, it helps parents navigate the public school system and the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA). The free guide is available by request; the NRC can supply bulk quantities of bilingual, postage-paid request cards for distribution in clinics, offices and other outlets.

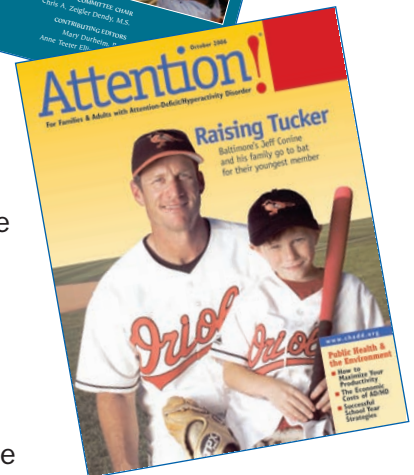
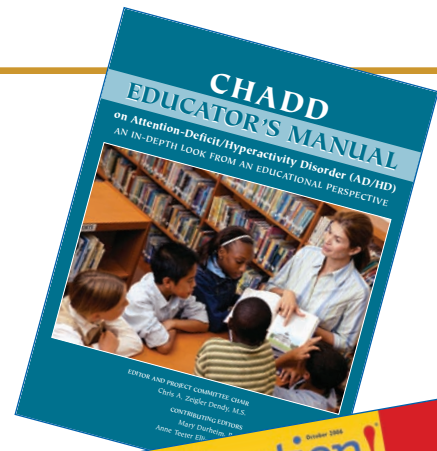

- The newly published **Educator's Manual on AD/HD** is an in-depth review of academic challenges and classroom interventions for students with AD/HD from preschool through high school.
